PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This highly structured, intensive group program offers treatment to adolescents seeking help with acute emotional and behavioral disorders. The PHP offers treatment for adolescents with psychiatric and co-occurring psychiatric and substance abuse disorders.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Provide crisis stabilization
- Teach clients to identify their thoughts and emotions
- Improve communication skills
- Develop strategies for redirecting high-risk behaviors
- Develop and strengthen coping and problem-solving skills
- Assist in the development of a support network
- Improve family communication.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- Multidisciplinary team approach to treatment
- Psychiatric evaluation
- Medication evaluation and monitoring
- Diagnostic evaluation
- Individualized treatment plans
- Group therapies:
 - Solution-focused psychotherapy
 - Social/coping skills
 - Cognitive-behavioral
 - Psychoeducation
 - Anger/stress management
- Substance abuse programming:
 - Substance abuse screening, assessment and counseling
 - Group therapy
- Individual sessions
- Family meetings
- Tutorial services

TREATMENT PHILOSOPHY

HOSPITAL TREATMENT TEAM

From the time of initial assessment, the patient is in the care of a highly skilled, multidisciplinary treatment team that includes a psychiatrist, case manager, psychiatric nurse, counselor and educational professional. Individuals who refer patients to the hospital are valued and respected members of the treatment team; contact is maintained with these professionals throughout the treatment process.

COMMUNICATION

The key to the patient's treatment success is that communication on all levels be paramount. Treatment team members work closely with appropriate outpatient providers and other support persons to ensure clear, consistent treatment planning and aftercare. Social workers, case managers, teachers and community service representatives work with the clinical team to see that communication related to treatment and aftercare planning is thorough and well-coordinated.

FAMILY INVOLVEMENT

Family involvement is a vital component of treatment, especially for adolescents. Family members are encouraged to express their opinions and feelings during group meetings. Program staff work to educate the family about the dynamics of illness, establish a framework for resolving frustrations and conflicts which may have developed, and teach the necessary skills to build healthy channels of communication.

DISCHARGE AND AFTERCARE

Working together with the treatment team, the patient and his or her family develop an appropriate discharge and aftercare plan. The goal is to assist the individual in maintaining ongoing treatment. The discharge and aftercare plan may include referrals to partial hospitalization, outpatient services with medication management, or other community-based programs.
